

**MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION WORK MEETING AND RETREAT**  
held Wednesday, July 30, 2014, at 8:30 a.m. in the Hunter Conference Center Rondthaler Boardroom at Southern Utah University.

The following Board Members were present: President Michelle Jorgenson, Harold Haynie, Becki Bronson, Shane Adams, and Stephen Allen.

The board members met at 7:30 a.m. for breakfast at the Main Street Grill and then went to SUU to begin the Board Retreat.

The board members participated in some teambuilding activities, reviewed board assignments, and discussed how to better communicate with patrons in the district. They discussed how to improve connections with the public and how to improve follow-up. They determined to delay their evaluation of Superintendent Dulaney until the August board meeting.

Superintendent Dulaney and Kent Peterson joined the Retreat at 10:05 a.m.

The board members continued their discussion of using Twitter and other available communication tools to better communicate with the public. They asked Superintendent Dulaney to arrange for a short training for them on the use of social media. Superintendent Dulaney suggested having Troy Lunt provide that training either in the August or September work meeting.

The board members reviewed the "Board Members: Code of Ethics" from the Coming to Order training guide provided by the Utah School Boards Association. All decisions should be driven by how they will make a difference for students rather than how they might impact board members. We need to solve issues at the lowest common denominator or level.

Mr. Haynie led a discussion on possibly having term limits for Iron District Board Members. He had spoken with Richard Stowell at USBA and he indicated that no other district in Utah had not done this and it would be a local district decision. Mr. Haynie suggested a three-term limit and there was general support for this. Mr. Allen felt that there always needed to be a good mix of rookies and veterans on the Board. Mr. Haynie will continue his research on this idea and keep the Board informed.

The Board had a break for lunch and resumed the meeting at 1:00 p.m.

The Board reviewed and discussed the 2013-14 district goals and how things went this past year. They also discussed and finalized the 2014-15 district goals.

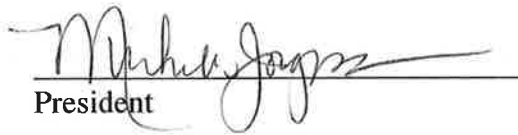
Dana Miller, President of the Southwest Applied Technology College, met with the Board. He invited everyone to attend the groundbreaking for their new building that will be held on August 28, 2014 at 1:00 p.m. He reminded the Board of his upcoming retirement and reviewed the selection process for naming his replacement. The lease

purchase of the current SWATC building from the Iron County School District will be final next year. The Board discussed the process to make sure everyone had a clear understanding of how the transfer will take place.

The Board reviewed the 2014-15 school calendar.

The Board discussed concerns over the traffic issues at Canyon View High School and Canyon View Middle School. Before school starts and after it ends each day the traffic is a mess and there are some real safety concerns. Mr. Peterson suggested that maybe the district could hire a consultant to do a full study and evaluation of both campuses and the traffic patterns and provide some recommendations for improvement. The Board supported this recommendation.

The Board discussed elementary enrollment projections. They also heard reports from district directors regarding their areas of responsibility.
